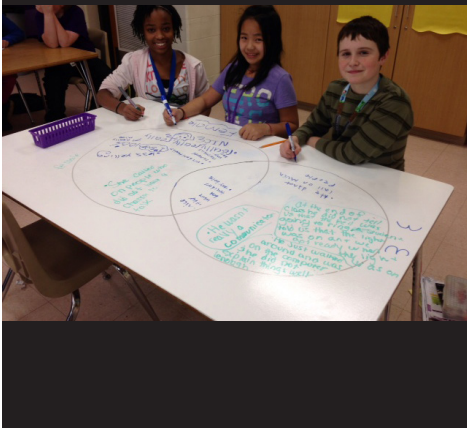

Advanced Placement Test Performance: 646 high school students took 792 AP Tests with 75% passing with a score of 3 or higher on a 5 point scale.

Programs of Interest:

- Head Start and four-year-old kindergarten. A nature-based four-year-old kindergarten is located at Bay Beach Wildlife Sanctuary.
- Spanish immersion program at Baird, Danz, Wilder and Jackson elementary schools and Edison Middle School.
- Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) at Washington Middle School and East High Schools.
- The prestigious International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme is offered at West High School. Chappell Elementary and Franklin Middle School are also authorized for the IB Primary Years and Middle Years Programme.
- Spanish, French and German are offered at the middle and high schools. Italian, Mandarin Chinese, and American Sign Language are also offered at the high schools.
- East High School Institute for the Fine Arts . Webster Elementary School is now an integrated arts school.
- John Dewey Academy for Learning charter school offers project-based learning for students in grades 8-12. Aldo Leopold Community School offers K-8 students an alternative choice.
- A Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) partnership with NWTC at Southwest High School and Lombardi Middle School. King and Elmore Elementary also offer a STEM program.
- Langlade Elementary School and Lombardi Middle School host a school within a school for academically gifted students. A separate building is planned for the 2013-14 school year.
- The district has a school wellness partnership with Bellin Health called THRIVE.
- Concurrent Credit Classes (earn both college & high school credit), AP Classes starting sophomore year, and Youth Options (classes at local colleges).
- Gifted and Talented, Special Education, and English Language Learner programs.

2012-13 District & Staff Achievements:

- Southwest was ranked #32 in Wisconsin in Newsweek's 2013 Best High Schools.
- U.S. News and World Report named Preble and Southwest High Schools two of the top high schools in Wisconsin.
- West's application for candidacy for the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (IB MYP) was accepted. The school is an authorized Diploma Programme School.
- Chappell Elementary and Franklin Middle School were authorized as International Baccalaureate schools.
- Chappell, Keller and Kennedy elementary schools were named 2012-13 Wisconsin Schools of Recognition.
- East academic decathlon team took 2nd in the regional competition at UW-Green Bay. Senior Kurtis Casperson was named the Wisconsin Academic Decathlon "Top Scholar" in the state essay portion of the competition.
- Six East HOSA-Future Health Professionals attended the state competition in Wisconsin Dells. Alex Rodriguez scored 1st place in Medical Spelling, advancing him to the national competition.
- East's Morgan Nohr was one of 18 players selected to the Wisconsin State Soccer Olympic Development team.
- East's Andrew Pfluger placed second in the E-business event at the FBLA National Leadership Conference in Anaheim, Calif. Pfluger's achievement marks the highest finish of any East High School student who has made it to FBLA national.

- East's Monique Muehlethaler and Level 9 gymnast at Air Force gymnastics in Green Bay is the first gymnast from the Green Bay area to qualify for the Western National competition.
- Preble's Sting Cancer group recently received the Young Philanthropist Award from St. Mary's/St. Vincent in recognition of exceptional charitable support
- Preble's Austin Mease was one of six state finalists nominated by State Superintendent Tony Evers for the U.S. Presidential Scholars Program.
- Preble's Spencer Guo was ranked 2nd in the state of Wisconsin for the 2013 National French Contest in French Level 2.
- Preble's Jill Englebert was named the FRCC Girls Cross Country Champion. The girls cross country team finished 14th at the state meet.

Hiedeman received the Breakthrough Athlete of the Year Award, Paup was honored as Coach of the Year, and Torres received the Night of Champions MVP Award.
- Southwest science teacher Scott Liddicoat was chosen as the recipient of the Wisconsin K-12 Energy Education Program's Formal Educator of the Year Award for 2013.
- Southwest's Austin Sturdivant was the conference runner-up in the 50 free and the 2013 FRCC Conference champion in the 100 free
